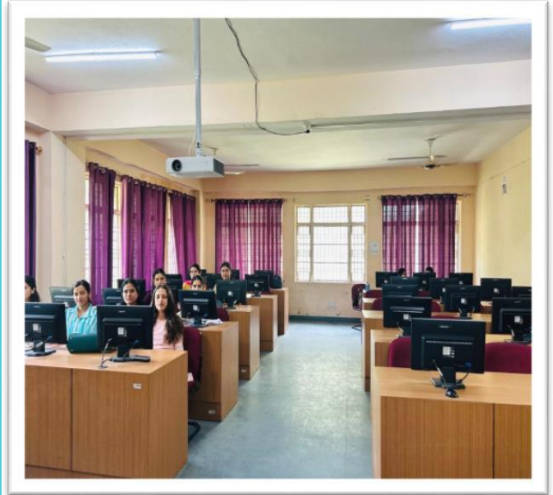

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

The college is named after the country's prominent freedom fighter, great administrator and the recipient of the Bharat Ratna-- Sh. Govind Ballabh Pant, and is duly affiliated to Himachal Pradesh University (Shimla). This college came into existence in July, 1959 but was formally inaugurated on 11th November, 1959 by Raja Bajrang Bahadur Singh of Bhadri estate, the then lieutenant Governor of Himachal Pradesh. Situated on the left bank of the river Satluj, the college is on the national highway no. 5 and at a distance of about 130 km from the historical town of Shimla, the capital city of Himachal Pradesh.

The college is a co-educational institution and imparts meaningful education in the faculties of Humanities, Science, Commerce, Vocation, and Computer Applications. After its inception in 1959 for undergraduate programmes, the year 1994 marked its new phase of academic development with the opening of Postgraduate classes in the subject of Hindi, English, Commerce, History, Economics, and Political Science. In the year 2017, the new PG courses in the subject of Sociology, Geography, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physics and Mathematics were introduced. The self- finance course of Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) was started in the academic session 2010-11, based on the feedback of the stakeholders. The skill-oriented Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) was added to the programmes of the college in the year 2017. The primary objective for the implementation of these courses is to empower the youth with practical knowledge that will lead to quality employment and income generating opportunities.

The college campus has a green cover of trees, a sprawling playground and a well-equipped auditorium that provide a healthy ambience for the holistic growth of the students beyond their classrooms. It is surrounded by the scenic beauty of hills that provides the students with ample green space to learn and interact in a lively fresh environment. 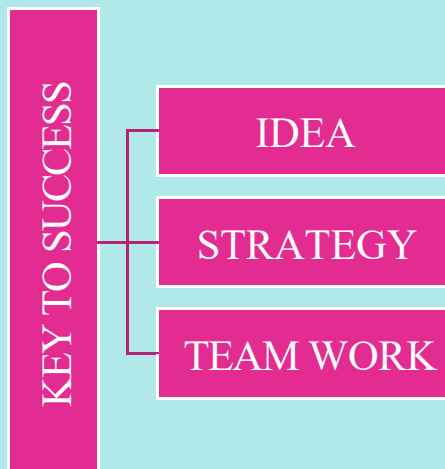

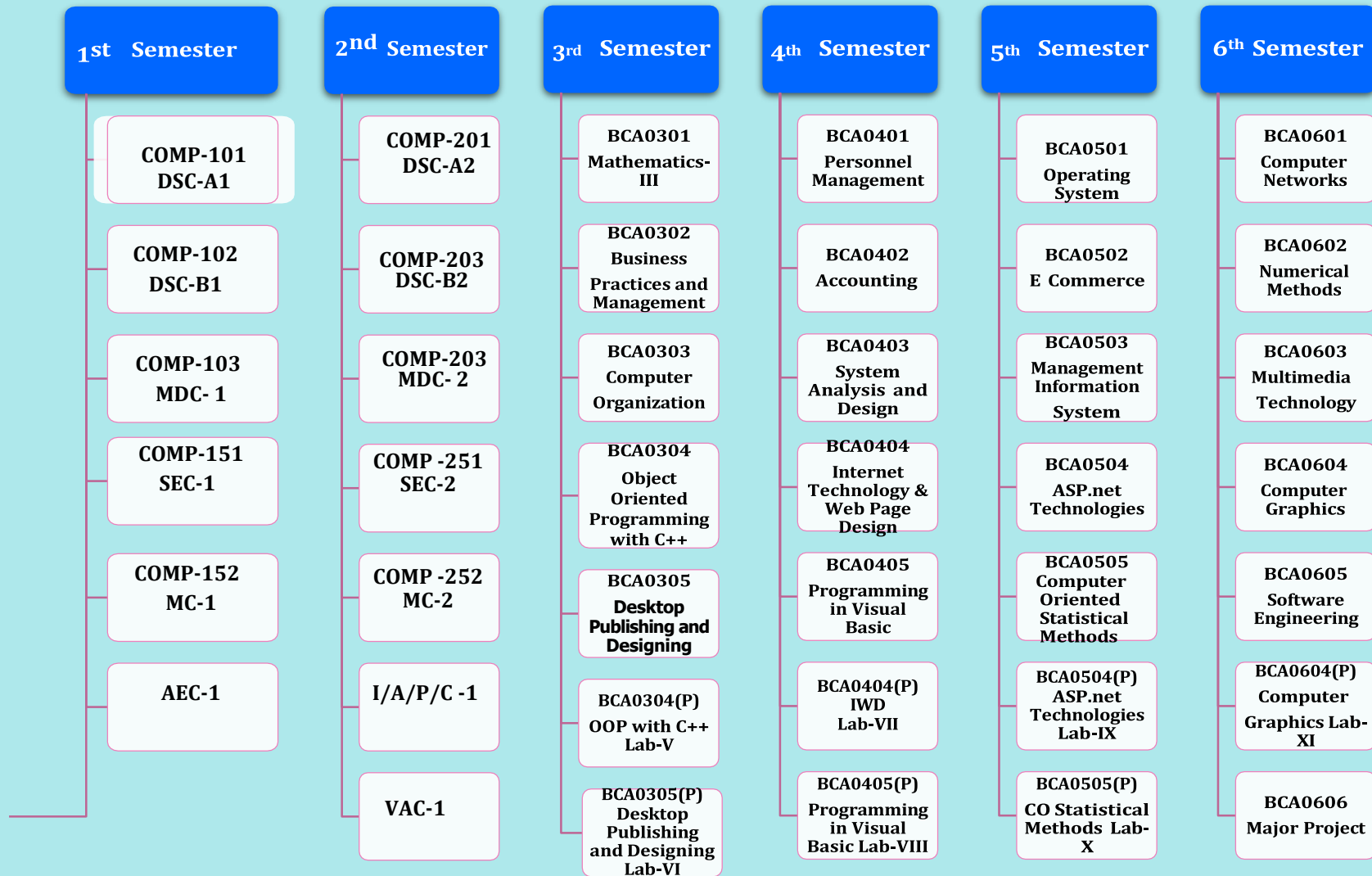

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION:

- English shall be the medium of instruction and examination.
- The pass percentage in each subject will be 45%

Theory Papers: (CBCS Semester system)

For regular students each paper will be of 100 marks (70 marks of theory exam and 30 marks for Internal assessment) and the duration of each paper will be 3 hours.

Practical Examination:

Practical examination of 50 marks (35 marks for Practical and 15 marks for Internal Assessment) of duration 3 hours will be conducted by the external examiner from the panel submitted by Chairman, Computer Science Department, Himachal Pradesh University and duly approved by the University/Evaluation Branch, HPU Shimla.

Project work:

In 6th Semester a student has to develop one project, which will be evaluated by the external examiner from the panel submitted by the Chairman, Computer Science Department, Himachal Pradesh University, and duly approved by the University Authority/Evaluation Branch, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla on the following basis:

Admission to BCA Programme

Instructions for Admission to BCA

The candidates will have to download the college prospectus from the college website www.gbpmgcrampur.edu.in. The candidates are advised to read the various instructions regarding admission in the prospectus before applying for admission. The candidates seeking admission should **apply online w.e.f.**

1st June, 2026 to 19th June, 2026. The students appearing in the merit list will undergo online counselling by the admission committee and the recommended students will have to deposit the prescribed fee within the stipulated period as per the HPU /College schedule. Later on, every student will also have to approach the admission /scrutiny committee for physical verification as per the schedule notified by the college.

Important: Provisionally admitted students (who have deposited the Fee) should note that it is compulsory for them (and their parents) to submit an online Anti-Ragging undertaking affidavit every academic year by visiting the website: https://www.antiragging.in/affidavit_registration_disclaimer.html (Please select the option of “Affiliated College” for the submission). Do not forget to note down the REFERENCE NUMBER that is generated on the submission of the affidavit form. After filling up the form the student can download the undertakings (of both students and parents) from the website:

https://www.antiragging.in/undertaking_request.php by using the REFERENCE NUMBER. Remember to write down the REFERENCE NUMBER of the Anti-Ragging Undertaking in the appropriate column given in the downloaded Application form.

1. BCA 1st Semester

Eligibility: Candidates who have passed 10+2 examination from H.P. Board / CBSE / ICSE or any other examination considered equivalent to 10+2 by the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla-5, with 40% Marks (35% marks for SC/ST category), shall be eligible.

Age Limit: Maximum age limit for admission to BCA course is 21 years for general category, 24 years for SC/ST category and 23 years for girl students, as on 1st July of the year concerned. The Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of six months.

Documents Required and Instructions for Admission to BCA 1st Semester

List of Documents to be uploaded during the online submission of application

1. Original Matriculation Certificate for the proof of date of birth
2. Original 10+2 certificate
3. Applicants coming from Board/University other than the HP Board of School Education/HP University must upload Original Migration Certificate
4. Original Character Certificate issued from the office of the Head/ Principal of Institution / School last attended or by a gazetted officer in the case of private candidates. The character certificate should have been issued within the last six months on the day of application
5. In the case of gap year, a completely filled self-declaration form (the format is available as Annexure 1 at the end of the prospectus and can also be downloaded from the college website.
6. In the case of gap year, Original character certificate issued by the SDM of the area concerned (Character certificate issued other than the above will not be accepted.) The character certificate should have been issued within the last six months on the day of application
7. Original SC/ST /OBC Certificate (SC/ST/ OBC candidates only)
8. Original EWS Certificate, IRDP Certificate, Ex-servicemen Certificate, WFF Certificate and PH Certificate (for candidates applying under these categories)
9. In case of non-subsidized seats (NRIs/NRI sponsored candidates & foreign national) the following additional documents are also required:
 - a) Sponsorship documents in case of non-subsidized seats (NIRs/NRI sponsored candidates).
 - b) Proof of the nationality in case of a foreign national.
 - c) In case of non-subsidized seats (NRIs) either of the following shall be considered as proof of their status:
 - i. Copy of the non-resident card/employment card issued by the employer
 - ii. Photocopy of the immigration/employment visa entry on the passport along with that of passport
 - iii. Certificate issued by the Indian Embassy / High Commission of the country where residing
 - iv. Photocopy of the latest assessment order of the income tax authorities either in or the country of emolument filled in the status of non- resident Indian
 - d) Certificate of sponsorship from an NRI in case of a sponsored candidate, along with proof of NRI status of the sponsored as required under part (b) above.

List of Documents Required at the Time of Physical Verification:

For the physical verification the students shall have to bring the following documents along with **two passport size photographs**:

- i. Downloaded Application form (*The parents/guardians must sign the undertaking on the 2nd page of the downloaded application to ensure that their wards will not take part in ragging, smoking and any other anti -institutional activity which brings disgrace to the college*)
- ii. Downloaded copy of Anti-Ragging undertaking by the student
- iii. Downloaded copy of Anti-Ragging undertaking by the parent
- iv. Fee slip
- v. Original Character Certificate for submission
- vi. Original Migration Certificate submission (for candidates coming from Board/ University other than H.P. Board of School Education/ H.P. University)
- vii. Self-attested copy of all uploaded documents

Preparation of Merit List

- The admission to BCA course is based on the merit alone.
- Separate merit list shall be prepared for subsidized & non-subsidized categories. The 35 subsidized seats will be filled first and the remaining 25 seats in non-subsidized category will be filled after all the seats in subsidized category are filled.
- Admission to the course for **subsidized** seats shall be as per the HP University 200 Point roster.
- For **non-subsidized** seats, the admission shall be based on the merit list prepared as per the percentage scored in +2 examination. The HP University roster will not be applicable for admission under non-subsidized seats.

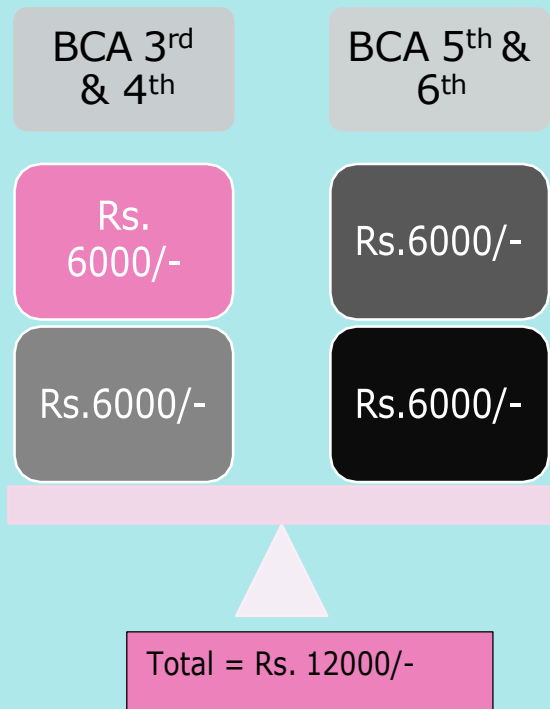

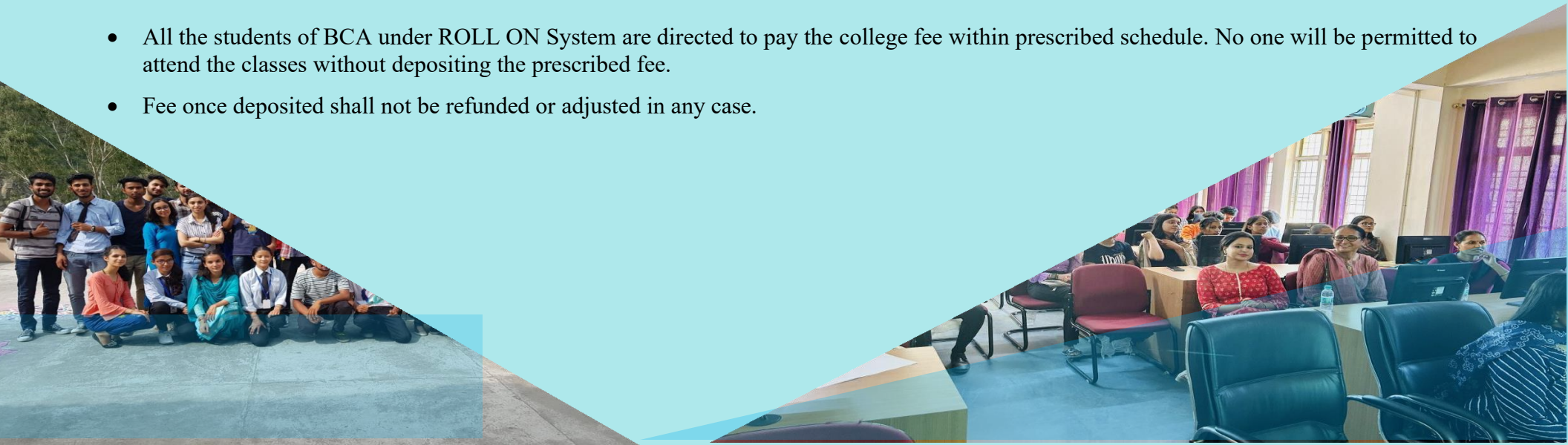

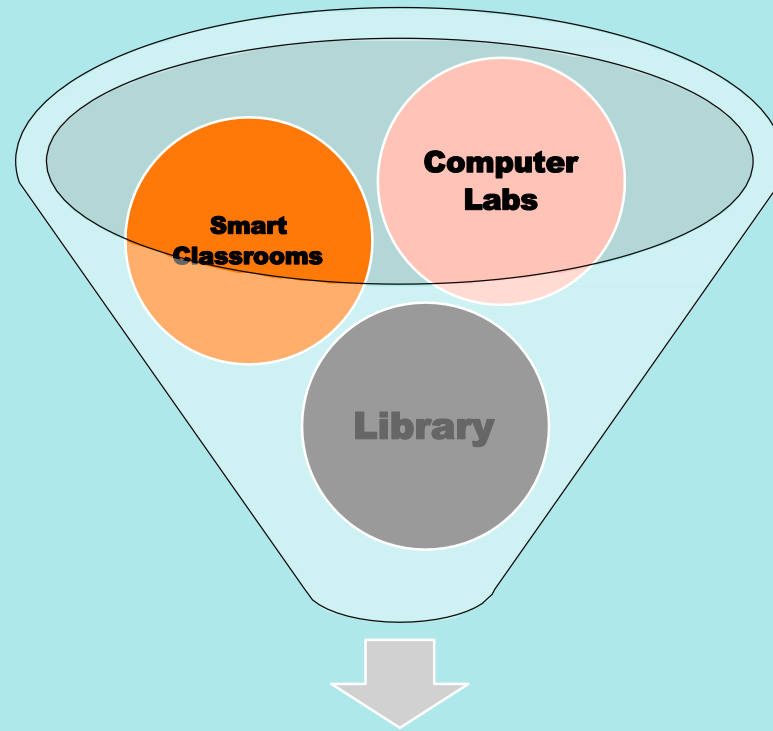

Admission to PGDCA:

Instructions for Admission to PGDCA

The candidates will have to download the college prospectus from the college website www.gbpmgcrampur.edu.in. The candidates are advised to read the various instructions regarding admission in the prospectus before applying for admission. The candidates seeking admission should **apply online w.e.f. 1st June, 2026 to 19th June, 2026**. The students appearing in the merit list will undergo online counselling by the admission committee and the recommended students will have to deposit the prescribed fee within the stipulated period as per the HPU /College schedule. Later on, every student will also have to approach the admission /scrutiny committee for physical verification as per the schedule notified by the college.

Important:

- Provisionally admitted students (who have deposited the Fee) should note that it is compulsory for all of them (and their parents) to submit an online Anti-Ragging undertaking affidavit every academic year by visiting the website: https://www.antiragging.in/affidavit_registration_disclaimer.html (*Please select the option of “Affiliated College” for the submission*).
- **Do not forget to note down the REFERENCE NUMBER that is generated on the submission of the affidavit form.** After filling up the form the student can download the undertakings (of both students and parents) from the website :https://www.antiragging.in/undertaking_request.php by using the REFERENCE NUMBER.
- Also, write down the REFERENCE NUMBER of the Anti-Ragging Undertaking the appropriate column given in the downloaded Application form.

Eligibility: Any graduate from recognized university or its equivalent with at least 50% marks (45% marks in case of SC/ST candidates) are eligible for admission to PGDCA course.

Age Limit: The maximum age limit for the candidates seeking admission to PGDCA programme shall be 26 years for male candidates, 28 years for female candidates and 29 years for SC/ST candidates as on 1 July of the admission year.

Preparation of Merit List

- The admission to PGDCA is based on the merit alone.
- Separate merit list shall be prepared for subsidized & non-subsidized categories. The 40 subsidized seats will be filled first and the remaining 20 seats in non-subsidized category will be filled after all the seats in subsidized category are filled.

FOR SUBSIDIZED SEATS:

Admission to the course for **subsidized category** shall be made as per the rules & the 120 point roster of HP University in the following manner:

- i. 15% and 7.5% seats shall be reserved for SC and ST candidates respectively who have passed BA/B.Sc./B.Com or any other equivalent degree from any recognized University.
- ii. The remaining 77.5% seats shall be filled as : 2.5% of the seats for admission shall be open for all the candidates irrespective of the institution from where they have passed their qualifying examination and 75% of the seats shall be filled out of the candidates who have passed their graduation from HP University subject to the following reservations:
 - 5% of the seats shall be reserved for the outstanding sports person
 - 5% of the seats shall be reserved for the outstanding cultural activists
 - 5% of the seats shall be reserved for the physically disabled candidates

8. For single girl child reservation, the single girl child will have to submit certificate from the competent authority, i.e., Secretary of Gram Panchayat. Single girl child means a girl who is the only child of her parents and she has no other brother and sister.

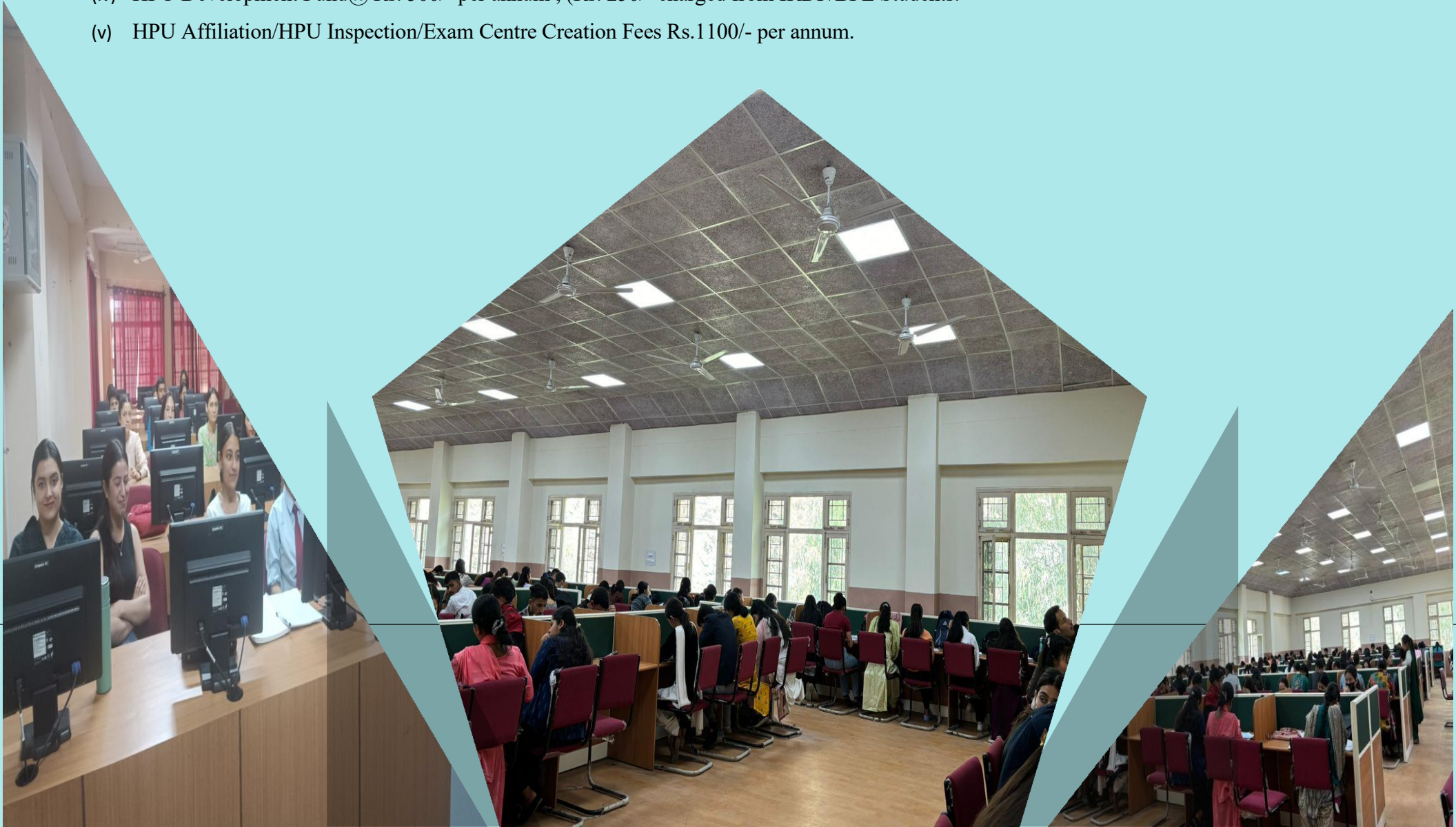

Refusal And Cancellation of Admission: (In accordance with HPU Ordinance)

Cancellation of Provisional Admission at the time of physical verification: If any student fails to produce the original documents for verification, and submit the attested copies of required documents along with the Original Character certificate, Original Migration Certificate (if applicable) & Self Declaration for gap in education (format available as Annexure 1 at the end of the prospectus), then his/her provisional admission can stand cancelled.

*** Note: All admissions made by the college are provisional till regularized by H.P. University.**

Fine Related to Absence in the Class BCA and PGDCA

- After continuous absence from a class for a period of 10 days in Annual System , the name of the student will be struck-off from the college rolls and the information for the same will be displayed on the notice board and college web site.

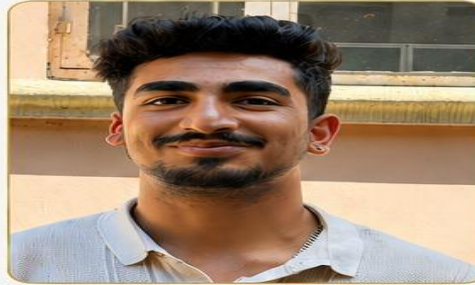

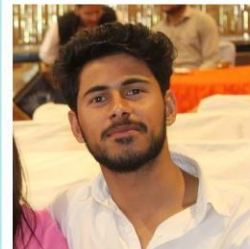

HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

The College has the facility of three hostels for the girls and one for the boys of the college:

- i) Tribal Girls' Hostel for 120 Girls
- ii) Bhadri Girls' Hostel for 60 Girls.
- iii) Tribal Boys' Hostel for 70 Boys
- iv) Dr. Ambedkar Girls' Hostel for 48 Girls

Admission Process

Admission to the hostels is granted strictly on merit and good conduct basis. In Tribal (Boys/Girls') Hostels, first preference will be given to the tribal boy/girl students and if seats fall vacant, SC/OBC, Backward Area and General Category boys/girls are also allowed. In Bhadri Girl's Hostel, the seats reserved for the SC/ST/OBC and Physically Handicapped girls are 15%, 7.5% and 5% respectively. The application forms along with the required documents/certificates, for admission to any of the above hostels should reach the concerned hostel warden/clerk on or before the last date of admissions notified by the college. All the senior hostel residents are informed that they should apply for the hostel accommodation well in time failing which the vacant seats will be given to the students seeking admission in the college hostel.

3. For other important and detailed information hostellers are advised to go through the hostel prospectus separately

SOCIAL OUTREACH

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC):

NCC training instills a feeling of patriotism and discipline in the cadets for upholding the unity and integrity of our country and it prepares them for rendering services to our motherland in times of peace and natural calamities. The college unit offers two army wings with two caretaker officers (CTOs). The students may join NCC by filling in enrolment form available in the college office. The students enrolled under NCC are required to attend minimum 40 parades in a session as per the schedule. It is compulsory to attend these parades in addition to 2 camps in order to appear for 'B' & 'C' certificate examinations. The cadets also learn mountaineering and rock climbing under different camps.

NATIONAL SERVICES CHEME (NSS):

The college has two units of NSS with hundred volunteers each. The units follow the motto "Not Me But You" and actively organize cleanliness drives, plantation drives and awareness programs in the college as well as in the adopted villages. The volunteers also participate in a seven day special camp every year. A NSS certificate is given to a volunteer who devotes 120 hours of social work in one year for a certain or cumulative period, i.e., 240 hours in two years and attend the special camp of seven days.

ROVERS AND RANGERS:

The college runs a unit of Rovers (Boys) and Rangers (Girls) programme under one Ranger Leader and one Rover Leader. The college unit comprises of 24 Rovers and 24 Rangers. The students enrolled as Rovers and Rangers in the college are given training for the service of the Nation and

humanity at large. Various activities with an aim to encourage the spirit of national integration and oneness are organized by the unit. The activities include adventure sports, community development, organizational work, skill development & awareness programmes organized by Bharat Scouts & Guides New Delhi. The Rangers and the Rovers earn various badges through their training camps. Aiming at the development of young students in achieving their physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potential as individuals; the college runs Rovers & Rangers. There are 24 seats respectively for Rovers & Rangers in the college, for which application forms are invited in the beginning of academic session, after scrutinising the forms the selected students will be induced in R&R after completing codal formalities accordingly.

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Parent Teacher Association (PTA):

To encourage community participation in education, Parent Teacher Association (PTA) under sections 2.33 to 2.33.7 of the H.P. Education Code, 2001 has been established. Parent Teacher Association (PTA) has emerged as an effective solution to the problems of students and teachers in the field of education. It is a non-political body for better co-ordination and interaction between parents and teachers for improvement of academic standards and infrastructural facilities of the college, giving utmost priority to students' welfare. Parents or guardians who are in the blood relation of the students, teachers and head of the institution are the members of the association. Parents are advised to attend the General House and other meetings for which information is circulated through proper medium.

College Students' Central Association (CSCA):

The College Students' Central Association (CSCA) is a representative body of students to train them for their duties, responsibilities and rights of citizenship. The main function of CSCA is to ensure the maintenance of proper academic atmosphere and discipline among the students. All the colleges affiliated to HP University have their CSCA as per its guidelines. **The CSCA body consists of nominated posts of President, Vice-President, General Secretary, Joint Secretary and Class Representatives.** The nomination takes place on the basis of HPU Grade Cards. The Principal acts as the Chief Advisor with Five Teacher Advisors nominated by him/her. As many as 16 students with outstanding performance in academic, cultural and co-curricular activities are also nominated by the Head of Institution. The nomination of CSCA office bearers and class representatives is held on the date notified by H.P. University.

ACADEMIC OUTREACH

IGNOU Study Centre- 1110:

Indira Gandhi National Open University, New Delhi, opened a study centre in this college in 1996. CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Leave Rules:

1. A student can proceed on leave with the prior permission from the college Principal. The application should also be prior signed by parent/ guardian of the student and duly recommended by the teacher.
2. A teacher can sanction leave up to maximum of 5 days and leave for longer duration will be sanctioned by the college Principal.

Note: The general leave will only be counted for the relaxation in fine only and not be counted as the lecture attended. In case of participation in sports, cultural, NCC, NSS and other activities, the credit will be given to the students and will be counted as lecture attended.

Other Rules and Regulations

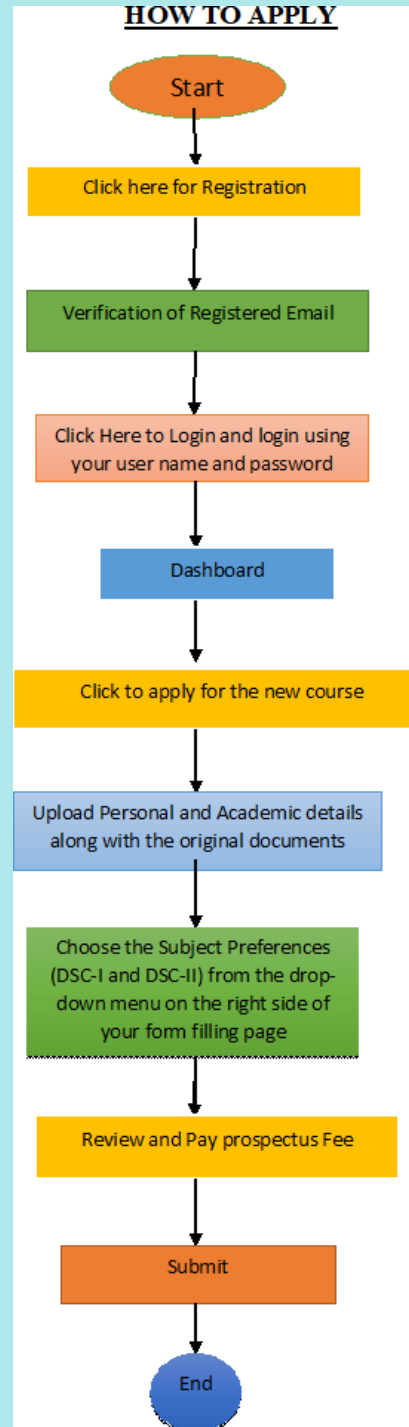
1. A student without an identity card, duly signed by the Principal, is deemed an outsider.
2. Without identity card no student is allowed to enter the college.
3. It is mandatory for every student to maintain strict discipline within the college premises. Any act of a student that amounts to indiscipline will be dealt strictly. The following act comes within the ambit of indiscipline and misconduct: -
 - Ragging in and around the college campus
 - Eve-teasing
 - Scribbling/ Writing anything on the black-board, furniture, walls etc.
 - Damaging college property-- Breaking furniture/ window panes/ Tempering electrical and water fittings

- Removing notices
- Holding any meeting/ function/ party & taking photographs in the college premises without prior permission of the Principal
- Using foul language with any student/ Principal/ teacher or any other employee of the college
- Bringing outsiders to the campus
- Smoking/ chewing tobacco/ taking drugs/ intoxicants/ alcohol anywhere in the college premises
- Spitting
- Any other act or acts which the Principal considers as major acts of misconduct and indiscipline

Strict action will be taken against defaulters.

4. All the students are directed to read the notices thoroughly which are displayed exclusively on the college notice board every day and do the needful accordingly.
5. Use of mobile phones in the class rooms or anywhere in the college campus is strictly prohibited in order to maintain academic environment. Any student found using mobile phones in the classroom/ examination hall will be viewed seriously.
6. The name of a student shall be struck off from the college rolls, if there is an absence without sanctioned leave continuously for 10 days or more.
7. Regarding Readmission: If the name of a student is struck off, he/ she must be accompanied by his/ her parent or guardian at the time of admission. Re-admission will only be granted after the recommendation of the teacher concerned and the final approval by the Principal. The student must seek re-admission within six days.

Fee structure and Mode of Payment

However, the Applicants are required to follow the procedure mentioned below for payment of the fees:-

- After submitting application, [‘Pay prospectus fee’](#) link will be visible in the second grid of dashboard page. Applicant(s) will be able to see applications submitted by them in the application status grid with fees payment (prospectus fees) status.
- [‘Pay prospectus fee’](#) link will be available there only for those applications for which the prospectus fees is not already paid.
- Fee can only be deposited from various online mode.
- **Online Payment** - Applicant(s) can pay using Net banking, Debit Card, UPI (*GooglePay, Phone Pe, Paytm, Bhim*, etc Payment to the college).

- ✓ Original Character Certificate issued from the office of the Head/ Principal of Institution / School last attended or by a gazette officer in the case of private candidates. The character certificate should have been issued within the last six months on the day of application
- ✓ In the case of gap year, a completely filled self-declaration form (the format is available as Annexure 1 at the end of the prospectus and can also be downloaded from the college website.
- ✓ In the case of gap year, Original character certificate issued by the SDM of the area concerned (Character certificate issued other than the above will not be accepted.) The character certificate should have been issued within the last six months on the day of application
- ✓ Himachal Bonafide Certificate (for tuition fee concession in case of girls)
- ✓ Original SC/ST /OBC Certificate issued by competent authority (SC/ST/ OBC candidates only)
- ✓ Original EWS Certificate, IRDP Certificate, Ex-servicemen Certificate, WFF Certificate and PH Certificate issued by competent authority (for candidates applying under these categories)
- ✓ For single girl child reservation, the single girl child will have to submit certificate from the competent authority, i.e., Secretary of Gram Panchayat. Single girl child means a girl who is the only child of her parents and she has no other brother and sister.
