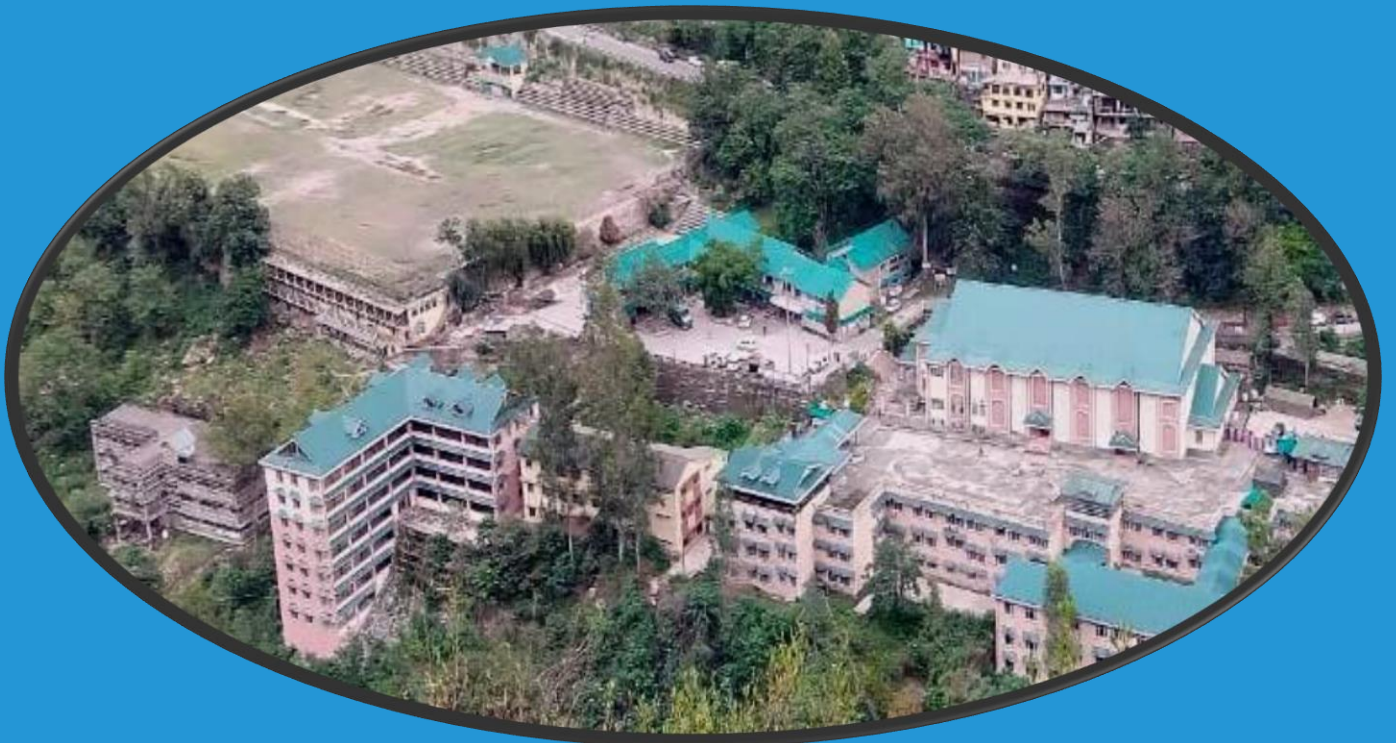

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

The college is named after the country's prominent freedom fighter, great administrator and the recipient of the Bharat Ratna Sh. Govind Ballabh Pant, and is duly affiliated to Himachal Pradesh University (Shimla). This college came into existence in July, 1959 but was formally inaugurated on 11th November, 1959 by Raja Bajrang Bahadur Singh of Bhadri estate, the then lieutenant Governor of Himachal Pradesh. Situated on the left bank of the river Satluj, the college is on the national highway no. 5 and at a distance of about 130 km from the historical town of Shimla, the capital city of Himachal Pradesh.

The college is a co-educational institution and imparts meaningful education in the faculties of Humanities, Science, Commerce, Vocation, and Computer Applications. After its inception in 1959 for undergraduate programmes, the year 1994 marked its new phase of academic development with the opening of Postgraduate classes in the subject of Hindi, English, Commerce, History, Economics, and Political Science. In the year 2017, the new PG courses in the subject of Sociology, Geography, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physics and Mathematics were introduced. The self- finance course of Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) was started in the academic session 2010-11, based on the feedback of the stakeholders. The skill-oriented Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) was added to the programmes of the college in the year 2017. The primary objective for the implementation of these courses is to empower the youth with practical knowledge that will lead to quality employment and income generating opportunities.

The college campus has a green cover of trees, a sprawling playground and a well-equipped auditorium that provide a healthy ambience for the holistic growth of the students beyond their classrooms. It is surrounded by the scenic beauty of hills that provides the students with ample green space to learn and interact in a lively fresh environment. With modern laboratories and library, the learning experience of the students becomes extensive and practical. There are three girls' hostels and one boys' hostel which make the college an ideal centre for learning and knowledge. An Overview of the UGC-CBCS Undergraduate Programmes:

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising Core, Compulsory, Skill Enhancement and Elective Courses. The courses are evaluated by following a grading system. In order to bring uniformity in the evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

Outline of Courses under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):

1. **Core Course:** A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as Core Course.
2. **Elective Course:** Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
 - 2.1 **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:** Elective course offered by the main Discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of Interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
 - 2.2 **Dissertation/Project:** An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.
 - 2.3 **Generic Elective (GE) Course:** An elective course which is other than discipline specific core course and is chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic elective.
3. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** The Ability Enhancement Courses (AE) may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement: (i) Environmental Science and (ii) English/MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.
 - 3.1 **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** Environmental Science, English Communication/Modern Indian Language (MIL) Communication.
 - 3.2 **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge.

Evaluation System of Undergraduate CBCS Programme

As per RUSA/HP University guidelines, the marks scheme for all undergraduate courses in annual system for **B.A./B.Com.** will be in the ratio of **70:30**, i.e.70 marks for theory (Annual/Term End Examination) and 30 marks for **Continuous Comprehensive Assessment(CCA)/Internal Assessment (IA)**. In annual system for all courses of **B.Sc and B.Com practical subjects**, the ratio will be **50:20:30**, i.e.50 marks for theory and 20 marks for practical (Annual/Term End) and 30 marks for **CCA/IA**.

As per University norms 30% marks of CCA will be determined by the concerned teacher in the annual system on the basis of following components:

1. House Test =10
2. Term Test/Class Test =05
3. Assignments/Seminars =10
4. Classroom Attendance=5

However, in B.Sc. Physical Sciences, 30% marks of CCA will comprise of:

1. Assignment/ Quiz/ Seminar/model/ Mid-Term=15 marks
2. Lab Seminar/ Lab CCA=10 marks
3. Attendance: 05 marks

In the annual system classroom attendance will be defined as follows:

Note:-Term Test will be conducted by teacher on completion of 40% syllabi.

House Test on completion of 75% syllabi.

Mid Term/House Test

- One **Mid Term/House Test** of 10 marks (Annual System) will be conducted in each academic year.
- It is mandatory for every student to appear in the Mid Term/House Test and the marks obtained shall contribute to the total IA/CCA of 30%.
- As per University guidelines the students who do not get 35% marks in IA/CCA will not be allowed to appear in Annual Examination.

Other Information Related to Evaluation

1. Internal Assessment/Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and Term End Examinations will be as per RUSA provisions for annual system.
2. In annual system, the minimum passing marks is 40% in aggregate. However, it is mandatory to score 35% in CCA and also 35% in the Final Examination for passing.
3. A candidate failing either in one or two subjects/papers in annual examination will be placed under compartment in those subjects/papers. Such students will have only two chances one at supplementary stage and another at the annual stage to clear his/her compartment.
4. A candidate failing in three or more subjects/papers will be treated as fail in that year and will have to repeat the entire year.
5. The result shall be declared as per grading system and the students will have to complete the degree within 5 years.
6. Re-evaluation shall be applicable as per provisions of HP University ordinance for annual system.
7. Final examinations shall be held in the month of March/April and supplementary examinations in the month of September/October every year.

Note: The above guidelines/conditions may vary as per latest notification by the University.

Eligibility for Admission

1. **Bachelor of Arts (B.A Pass Course):** The students who have passed +2 examinations or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (including English) with 33% marks. However, the students opting Mathematics as one of the subjects of study must have 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at +2 level.
2. **Bachelor of Science (B.Sc. Pass Course):** +2 examinations or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four subjects (three science subjects & one English) with 45% marks. The students seeking admission in BSc 1st year (non-Medical) have the option to choose either Chemistry or Computer Science as one of the Discipline Specific Courses for study.
3. **Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com Pass Course):** The candidates with 40% marks in commerce stream or 45% marks in four written subjects, including English at +2 level, are eligible for admission to B.Com pass course. The minimum eligibility condition for a girl student to get admission in B.Com is 33% marks in +2 examination. However, for admission to B.Com pass course the candidate must have passed Mathematics/Economics as compulsory subject at his/her +2 stage.

- Note :**
- i. All the admissions in B.A/B.Sc/B.Com 1stYear will be made on the basis of merit of the qualifying examination, that is, on the basis of percentage/marks of +2 examination.
 - ii. The student placed under compartment or failed in +2 examinations are not eligible for seeking admission.

Age Limit and Relaxation

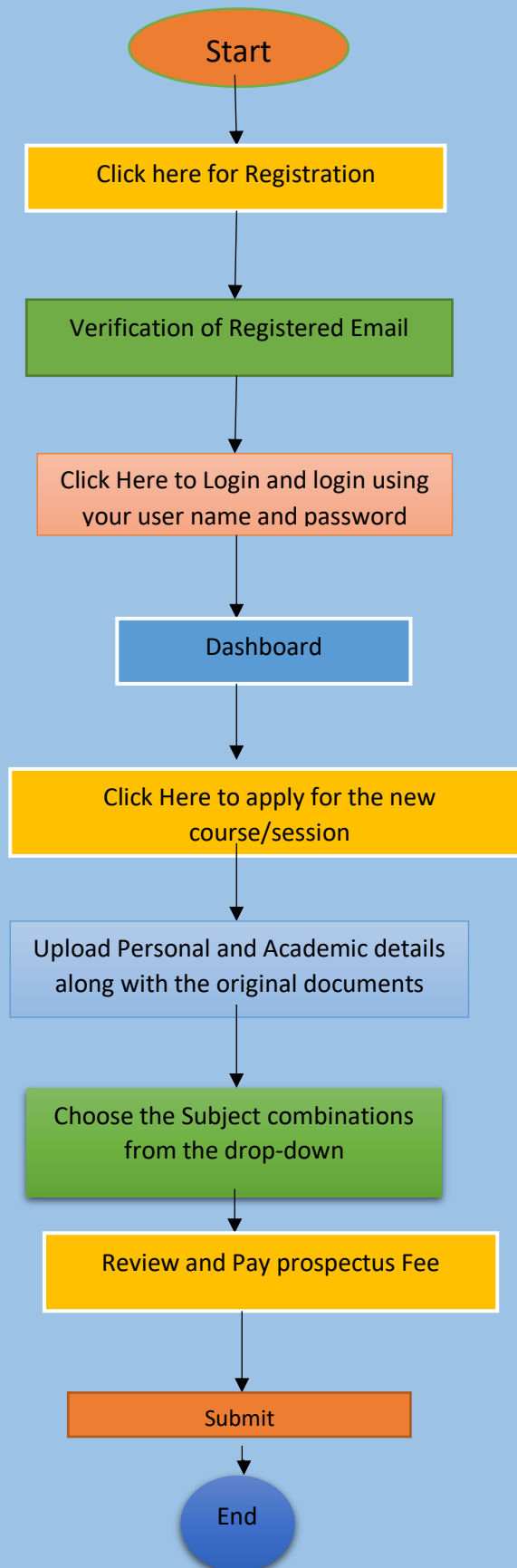
1. Admission is not granted to the student in 1stYear if he/she has attained the age of 23 in the case of boys and 25 in the case of girls on 1stJuly of the year concerned.

Admission to B.A/ B.Sc/ B.Com 2nd& 3rd Year Along with Guidelines

1. Admission to B.A/B.Sc/B.Com 2nd year and 3rd year is on **Roll on basis** for which they have to apply through **online mode only**.
2. In the roll on system, the students who have studied in 1st and 2nd year in the previous session are allowed to take provisional admission in the next class, i.e. in 2nd and 3rd year respectively, without waiting for the final result of the previous year.
3. The students have to fill up the online admission form and deposit the prescribed fee within the stipulated period as per the schedule notified by H.P. University. Admission schedule as notified by

H.P University will be displayed on the college website and the notice board of the college.

4. The printout/hard copy of the application form should also be submitted in as per the instructions from the college.

Instructions to Students Taking Roll On Admission:

1. The students admitted in B.A/ B.Sc/ B.Com 2nd year will study two more courses-- Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC 1 & SEC 2) -- in the subject/discipline of their first choice (DSC I) studied in 1st year. These two courses will be in additions to Core courses (DSCs & Compulsory English/Hindi/Sanskrit) studied in 1st year.
2. The students admitted in BA/ BCom 3rd year will study two Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSE 1 & DSE 2) and two Generic Elective Courses (GEs) along with two SECs (SEC 3 & SEC 4). It should be noted that DSE I & DSE II will be of the same discipline as DSC I & DSC II of the previous class respectively. The two GEs will be from any one discipline/ subject other than the two DSCs/DSEs.
3. The students of B.Sc 3rd year will study three DSEs (DSE I, DSE II & DSE III) and two SECs (SEC 3 & SEC 4).

Refusal and Cancellation of Admission: (In Accordance with HPU Ordinance)

1. The Principal may allow or refuse admission to any student on the recommendation of the admission committee.
2. Admission will not be granted after the expiry of admission dates.
3. *Cancellation of Provisional Admission at the time of physical verification:* If any student fails to produce the original documents for verification, and submit the attested copies of required documents along with the Original Character certificate, Original Migration Certificate (if applicable) & Self Declaration for gap in education (format available as Annexure 1 at the end of the prospectus), then his/her provisional admission can stand cancelled.

HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

Admission Process

In Bhadri Girl's Hostel, the seats reserved for the SC/ST/OBC and Physically Handicapped girls are 15%, 7.5% and 5% respectively.
- The application forms along with the required documents/certificates, for admission to any of the above hostels should reach the concerned hostel warden/clerk on or before the last date of admissions notified by the college.
- All the senior hostel residents are informed that they should apply for the hostel accommodation well in time failing which the vacant seats will be given to the students seeking admission in the college hostel.

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Leave Rules:

1. A student can proceed on leave with the prior permission from the college Principal. The application should also be prior signed by parent/ guardian of the student and duly recommended by the teacher.
2. A teacher can sanction leave up to maximum of 5 days and leave for longer duration will be sanctioned by the college Principal.
3. The student should make sure that the leave is noted by all the concerned teachers.
4. Leave on account of illness, if more than three days, must be accompanied by the medical certificate.
5. Students participating in various inter-college or inter-university or other competitions including NCC camps will have to get their leave sanctioned by the college Principal on the recommendation of their in charges before their departure.

Note: The general leave will only be counted for the relaxation in fine only and not be counted as the lecture attended. In case of participation in sports, cultural, NCC, NSS and other activities, the credit will be given to the students and will be counted as lecture attended.

Other Rules and Regulations

1. A student without an identity card, duly signed by the Principal, will be considered as an outsider.

2. Without identity card no student is allowed to enter the college.
3. It is mandatory for every student to maintain strict discipline within the college premises. Any act of a student that amounts to indiscipline will be dealt strictly. The following act comes within the ambit of indiscipline and misconduct: -
 - Ragging in and around the college campus
 - Eve-teasing
 - Scribbling/ Writing anything on the black-board, furniture, walls etc.
 - Damaging college property-- Breaking furniture/ window panes/ Tempering electrical and water fittings
 - Removing notices
 - Holding any meeting/ function/ party & taking photographs in the college premises without prior permission of the Principal
 - Using foul language with any student/ Principal/ teacher or any other employee of the college
 - Bringing outsiders to the campus
 - Smoking/ chewing tobacco/ taking drugs/ intoxicants/ alcohol anywhere in the college premises
 - Spitting
 - Any other act or acts which the Principal considers as major acts of misconduct and indiscipline

Strict action will be taken against defaulters.

4. All the students are directed to read the notices thoroughly which are displayed exclusively on the college notice board every day and do the needful accordingly.
5. Use of mobile phones in the class rooms or anywhere in the college campus is strictly prohibited in order to maintain academic environment. Any student found using mobile phones in the classroom/examination hall will be viewed seriously.
6. The name of a student shall be struck off from the college rolls, if there is an absence without sanctioned leave continuously for 10 days or more.
7. Regarding Readmission: If the name of a student is struck off, he/ she must be accompanied by his/ her parent or guardian at the time of admission. Re-admission will only be granted after the recommendation of the teacher concerned and the final approval by the Principal.

The student must seek re-admission within six days.

SOCIAL OUTREACH

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC):

NCC training instills a feeling of patriotism and discipline in the cadets for upholding the unity and integrity of our country and it prepares them for rendering services to our motherland in times of peace and natural calamities. The college unit offers two army wings with two caretaker officers (CTOs). The students may join NCC by filling in enrolment form available in the college office. The students enrolled under NCC are required to attend minimum 40 parades in a session as per the schedule. It is compulsory to attend these parades in addition to 2 camps in order to appear for 'B' & 'C' certificate examinations. The cadets also learn mountaineering and rock climbing under different camps.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS):

The college has two units of NSS with hundred volunteers in each. The units follow the motto "Not Me But You" and actively organize cleanliness drives, plantation drives and awareness programs in the college as well as in the adopted villages. The volunteers also participate in a seven day special camp every year. A NSS certificate is given to a volunteer who devotes 120 hours of social work in one year for a certain or cumulative period, i.e., 240 hours in two years and attend the special camp of seven days.

ROVERS AND RANGERS:

The college runs a unit of Rovers (Boys) and Rangers (Girls) programme under one Ranger Leader and one Rover Leader. The college unit comprises of 24 Rovers and 24 Rangers. The students enrolled as Rovers and Rangers in the college are given training for the service of the Nation and humanity at large. Various activities with an aim to encourage the spirit of national integration and oneness are organized by the unit. The activities include adventure sports, community development, organizational work, skill development &

awareness programmes organized by Bharat Scouts & Guides New Delhi. The Rangers and the Rovers earn various badges through their training camps. Aiming at the development of young students in achieving their physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potential as individuals; the college runs Rovers & Rangers. There are 24 seats respectively for Rovers & Rangers in the college, for which application forms are invited in the beginning of academic session, after scrutinising the forms the selected students will be induced in R&R after completing codal formalities accordingly.

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Parent Teacher Association (PTA):

To encourage community participation in education, Parent Teacher Association (PTA) under sections 2.33 to 2.33.7 of the H.P. Education Code, 2001 has been established. Parent Teacher Association (PTA) has emerged as an effective solution to the problems of students and teachers in the field of education. It is a non-political body for better co-ordination and interaction between parents and teachers for improvement of academic standards and infrastructural facilities of the college, giving utmost priority to students' welfare. Parents or guardians who are in the blood relation of the students, teachers and head of the institution are the members of the association. Parents are advised to attend the General House and other meetings for which information is circulated through proper medium.

College Students' Central Association (CSCA):

The College Students' Central Association (CSCA) is a representative body of students to train them for their duties, responsibilities and rights of citizenship. The main function of CSCA is to ensure the maintenance of proper academic atmosphere and discipline among the students. All the colleges affiliated to HP University have their CSCA as per its guidelines. **The CSCA body consists of nominated posts of President, Vice-President, General Secretary, Joint Secretary and Class Representatives.** The nomination takes place on the basis of HPU Grade Cards. The Principal acts as the Chief Advisor with Five Teacher Advisors nominated by him/her. As many as 16 students with outstanding performance in academic, cultural and co-curricular activities are also nominated by the Head of Institution. The nomination of CSCA office bearers and class representatives is held on the date notified by H.P. University.

ACADEMIC OUTREACH

IGNOU Study Centre- 1110:

Indira Gandhi National Open University, New Delhi, opened a study centre in this college in 1996. This study centre provides opportunities to opt for job-oriented courses such as Rural Development, Human Rights, Tourism Studies, Food & Nutrition and Computer Education; Certificate Courses in Organic Farming and Sericulture; and Diploma in Value Added Products from Fruits Vegetables and Dairy Technology. The study

centre also provides Bachelors Degree in Arts and Commerce. The students can enroll themselves with this study centre for different Job-Oriented Certificate and Diploma Courses simultaneously with B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. degree courses. Learners can visit the website www.ignou.ac.in for more information.

ICDEOL Learning Support Centre:

International Centre for Distance and Open Learning H.P. University, Shimla has opened a learning Support Centre in this College in 2019. The objective of ICDEOL is to facilitate the students enrolled through Open Distance Learning Mode for UG and PG level courses in the college. The basic aim of the ICDEOL Learning Support Centre is to facilitate and to meet the academic requirements of the students belonging to far-flung areas of the region. The students can enroll in different courses for both UG and PG courses from ICDEOL, H.P. University Shimla.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Educational Tours and Excursion:

The college encourages and allows Educational Tours and Excursions during the session, under the guidelines laid down in letter No EDN-HEB(6) 2/2009-Misc Directorate of Higher Education Feb. 2019 as follows:

1. The faculty/staff accompanying the students will travel in the vehicle in which students are travelling.
2. Students will not be allowed to travel without accompany of teacher/staff deputed with them.
3. If girl students are participating the Educational Tour, one lady teacher must accompany the students.
4. Written consent of the parents is essential to allow the students for participating in the educational tour.
5. Tour programme should be signed and recommended by the Principal.
6. The students will not be allowed to perform any recreational activity during the tour.
7. The Educational Tour should be need based and part of course.
8. Tour programme must be intimated to the Deputy Commissioner of the respective District and local administration before departure.

College Magazine-- Kinner-Kailash:

The magazine "Kinner-Kailash", published annually, brings forth the literary talent of the students and provides them an opportunity for expressing their thoughts and ideas on different issues. The articles are collected by the end of every year. The student editors from different faculties/sections are selected through a written test and they are awarded with certificates and prizes at the college annual function.

Eco Club promotes the participation of students and teachers in knowing and improving our environment. The club aims to create mass awareness and incorporate as many people as possible for understanding our environment. Its objectives are:

- To create a clean and green consciousness among students through various innovative methods
- To organize plantation drives

Road Safety Club:

Road Safety Club is established to enhance the awareness about various issues of road safety among the students. It focuses on changing mindsets of students towards Safe Driving and First- Aid Training.
