
4. Steps Taken on Improvement:

The IQAC OF TE College has taken the following imitative/measures to overcome /resolve the concerns of the students collected on the basis of feedback.


- The College administration in collaboration with PTA Executive body has been making sincere

- Provisions are also being made for providing parking facilities to the students.


